# WAYNE STATE COLLEGE

There were 761 Wayne State College 2006 – 2007 graduates with 511 (67%) employed in Nebraska in the first quarter of 2008. This is a three percent decrease from the previous year. Nine different fields of study had 100% of the graduates employed in Nebraska but only 39 graduates in those nine fields of study. Graduates were employed in 42 of Nebraska's 93 counties. The highest number of Wayne State College graduates was employed in Douglas County followed by Madison County.

Master's Degree graduates in Business Administration and Management had the highest estimated average annual earnings of \$96,378 but the estimated median earnings of \$53,188. Thirteen of the 18 (72%) graduates were employed in Nebraska. Post Master's Certificate graduates in Superintendency and Educational System Administration had the second highest estimated average annual earnings of \$77,459. Nine of the 11 graduates (82%) were employed in

the state. Nineteen degree/fields of study had graduates with estimated average annual earnings higher than \$30,000.

The Education Services industry employed 212 graduates, more than in any other industry. The estimated average annual earnings were \$37,968. The Retail Trade industry employed second highest number of graduates (45) with estimated average annual earnings of \$22,745. The 13 graduates employed in the Wholesale Trade industry had the highest disclosable estimated average annual earnings of \$70,661, but the estimated median annual earnings were \$35,724.
